The 6th Annual Photo Issue Exhibition

June 10 through July 21, 2006

The 6th Annual Vice magazine Photo Issue Exhibition will be held this summer at Silverstein Photography in Chelsea. Silverstein is a staple of New York's high-end photography scene, and they will host the first large-scale exhibition of work taken from *Vice Magazine's* annual Photo Issue. Does this mean that it's finally safe to assume that rich people are joining the poor in understanding that *Vice* knows amazing photos when we see them? It just might.

The exhibition, running for six weeks, will encompass three sections of original work in color and black and white, curated by *Vice* Editor Jesse Pearson and Photo Editor Patrick O'Dell.

At the front of the show will be a gallery featuring the world-premiere solo show of Jerry Hsu. Jerry is a San Jose-based pro skateboarder and bon vivant whose pictures have been extensively featured in *Vice*, and whose first solo show will make a massive impression. He is *Vice's* favorite young male photographer. (We have a favorite young female one too. Her name is Jaimie Warren and she's also in the show.)

The main gallery will house the *Vice* photo show proper. Viewers will be confounded by a salon-style collection of the best photos *Vice* gathered this year. Some especially cherished *Vice* contributors like Ryan McGinley, Richard Kern, Terry Richardson, and Roe Ethridge will exhibit one large work each.

The exhibition's third gallery will feature combat photos from the Vietnam War, including work by Phillip Jones Griffith, Tim Page, Dana Stone, and Sean Flynn.
